



Lower Paxton Township supervisors examine future finances

Lower Paxton Township Supervisors reviewed a five-year projected financial plan for the township general budget that shows shortfalls from 2012 to 2016.

The revenue projections indicate modest growth in development and increased fees. Expenses are projected to increase an average of 2.5 percent a year, which includes salary and benefit adjustments required under contract and inflation adjustments for other expenses.

The plan does not include funding for capital projects and will not replenish declining township reserve funds, which have offset deficits in 2010 and 2011.

Supervisors said they will look at the impact of tax increases on the budget at a future meeting.

In other business, supervisors approved the sale of a scoreboard for \$1,750 to Northern York School District. The scoreboard from the Friendship Center was no longer being used.

Supervisors also approved a contract with Layne's Cleaners to clean police uniforms. The cost is \$1,000 a month.
